Talk It Over

"Jesus took his disciples with him to Gethsemane and said, 'Stay here with me while I pray.' Then he took Peter, James, and John a little further. He was filled with anguish and deep distress, and he said to them, 'My heart is so overwhelmed and crushed with sorrow that I feel like I'm dying. Just sit here and watch with me.' Then Jesus took a few more steps, fell to the ground and prayed..." Matthew 26:36-39

Question 1:

Why was it important for Jesus to take his disciples with him to the Garden of Gethsemane? When you are going through a hard time, is your normal response to reach out for support or to try to go through it alone? Why does it matter in times of crisis to be honest in prayer and open with trusted friends?

Question 2:

What does it mean to 'carry each other's burdens'? How can you live out this command to fulfill the law of Christ during the Covid-19 pandemic?

"Since Jesus went through suffering and temptation, he knows what it is like when we suffer and are tempted, and he is able to help us." Hebrews 2:18

Question 3:

What is Jesus able to do for us and why? How does this knowledge increase our confidence in him?

"Jesus said, "Here's what's going to happen: Soon I'll be gone and you'll be without me, but after a while, you'll see me again...You will weep and mourn and grieve...but your grief will eventually turn into joy. It will be like a woman going through labor pains. When her child is finally born, her anguish turns to joy because the new life wipes out the memory of the pain. In the same way, you'll go through sorrow now, but I'll be back and you will rejoice; and no one will be able to rob you of that joy!" John 16:16, 20-22

Question 4:

Because of the Covid-19 pandemic, many of us are overwhelmed with the unknown state of our future. Instead, we can hang on to what we know to be true. Which truths about God bring you comfort?

Question 5:

Since Jesus puts the "yes" to all of God's promises,, how can getting to know the Word of the One who turns crucifixions into resurrections better equip us for helping ourselves and others in times of crisis?
