1. "ONLY BEGOTTEN" MEANS THE ONLY ONE OF ITS KIND.

Talk It Over

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life." John 3:16 (NKJV)

"Christ is the visible image of the invisible God. He existed before anything was created and is supreme over all creation, for through Him God created everything in the heavenly realms and on earth. He made the things we can see and the things we can't see—such as thrones, kingdoms, rulers, and authorities in the unseen world. Everything was created through Him and for Him. He existed before anything else, and He holds all creation together." Colossians 1:15-17 (NLT)

Question 1

Why do you think it was important for God to send his only begotten Son rather than an angel, an ancient prophet or someone else?

2. God sent his only BEGOTTEN Son to become the INCARNATE Son, so that we might become ADOPTED sons and daughters of God.

"God sent [his Son] to buy freedom for us who were slaves to the law, so that he could adopt us as his very own children. And because we are his children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, prompting us to call out, 'Abba, Father.'" Galatians 4:5-6 (NLT)

What is the difference between being created by God and being adopted by God? How do we become an adopted child of God?

3. Jesus saves us from PUNISHMENT AFTER DEATH.

"Since we have been made right in God's sight by the blood of Christ, he will certainly save us from God's condemnation." Romans 5:9 (NLT)

4. Jesus relieves us from THE BROKENNESS OF LIFE.

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Acts 2:21 (NIV)

5. "For he, who had always been God by nature, (**DIVINITY**) did not cling to his prerogatives as God's equal, (WOW! God's equal—not subordinate, but equal!) but stripped himself of all privilege by consenting to be a slave by nature and being born as mortal man (**INCARNATION**). And, having become man, he humbled himself by living a life of utter obedience (**HUMILIATION**), even to the extent of dying, and the death he died was the death of a common criminal (**SUFFERING**). That is why God has now lifted him so high, and has given him the name beyond all names (**EXALTATION**), so that at the name of Jesus 'every knee shall bow,' whether in Heaven or earth or under the earth. And that is why, in the end, 'every tongue shall confess' that Jesus Christ is the Lord (**LORDSHIP**), to the glory of God the Father." Philippians 2:6-11
