Proverbs 13:16a (NIV)

All who are prudent act with knowledge.

Proverbs 19:20 (NLT)

Get all the advice and instruction you can, so you will be wise the rest of your life.

Matthew 16:18b (NLT)

Jesus said, "I will build my church, and all the powers of hell will not conquer it."
